Introduction

Wash Week 2005 is a celebration of life in and around The Wash from Hunstanton to Skegness on land and at sea.

The heritage of The Wash, in all forms, will be the focus for the week, be it: wildlife or man; marine or terrestrial; past or present; myth or fact. This programme of events has been co-ordinated by the Wash Estuary Strategy Group with the help of Lincolnshire Wildlife Trust. The whole week has been made possible through partnership working with many other organisations and groups.

The Wash is Britain's largest estuarine system with five rivers and the North Sea flowing in and out of it every day. The extensive areas of saltmarsh, mudflats and sandbanks provide excellent homes for an incredible array of wildlife.

But The Wash is not just about wilderness and wildlife it also has a highly rich and diverse cultural and historic heritage. The land and seascape tells the story of our forefathers; the rich archaeology indicates past industries and ways of life, and; the built heritage represents amazing wealth of past eras. Farming, military and maritime culture has strong ties with the area now and way back into the past. Great people and events are associated with The Wash, and The Wash has strong ties with mainland Europe.

Hence, the Wash Estuary Group is working with partners of the Wadden Sea area of Europe on developing conservation and management tools to ensure the sustainable use of heritage there and here. And as part of that raising awareness of what we have is an essential aspect in delivering our heritage to future generations, and Wash Week 2005 provides an excellent opportunity to do just that.

General tips and guidelines

Booking and Costs – It is best to book for all events or at least ring to check, that way preventing disappoint if you turn up on spec and there is no room for you and yours. Some of the events are free and some will be charged. If the charge is more than \$3.00 it is stated in the listings overleaf, but if it is \$3.00 or less it is not. Again it is best to ring the individual event organiser in advance.

Food and drinks – unless stated presume they may not be available or there will be associated charges. Best to check beforehand.

Transport and parking – if you are unfamiliar with the area we have provided a rough guide to indicate venue's locations, more specific information can be gathered at the local Tourist Information Centres: Skegness, Boston, Spalding, King's Lynn and Hunstanton. Parking is available at some sites but a charge may be incurred and free cycle racks are also available at some of the locations. Again it is best to check beforehand with the organiser.

Weather – The Wash is a wild place and the weather can change dramatically. Please check the weather forecast before setting out and wear appropriate clothing warm or wet. Hopefully being August we will have sunshine so bring hats, sunscreen and plenty of water. If you are going on one of the guided walks or visiting a nature reserve then stout footwear is recommended.

Children – children are welcome to nearly all of the events (bar where stated) but they should always be accompanied by an adult.

Dogs – are welcome at some of the events but must be kept on leads. At other events it is not appropriate to bring a dog. Please ring the individual event organiser to find out more.

Access – many of the events are fully accessible to wheelchairs. Please call the event organiser to check details and discuss arrangements where appropriate.




